DAY ONE

SATURDAY, MARCH 7

Arrive to Los Cabos / Sunset Cruise

Los Cabos is one of Mexico's most exclusive beach destinations, because it attracts the jet-set crowd, it's well connected and easy to get to. After arriving to Los Cabos airport, you will be taken to the marina where you will board the beautiful **Safari Endeavour**, operated by **Un-Cruise Adventures**, where you will have some time to get settled in your cabin and freshen up. AdventureWeek Baja Sur officially begins with a sunset cruise around Los Cabos' iconic rock arch, also known as "Land's End," where the Pacific Ocean and the Sea of Cortes meet. Baja California Sur and Los Cabos Tourism Board representatives will join you for the cruise, then you'll drop them off at the marina and continue your overnight journey towards Espiritu Santo Island.

SUNDAY, MARCH 8

Espiritu Santo Island / La Paz

After an early breakfast on board the **Safari Endeavour**, you will arrive in Ensenada Grande. You have the option today to explore the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Espiritu Santo Island by sea kayak with **Baja Outdoor Activities (BOA)**, or certified divers can SCUBA dive with **Fun Baja**.

Kayakers will paddle out into Ensenada Grande in either single or double boats. You'll have a guide who will show you why the Sea of Cortes is one of the most popular paddling spots in North America. The coastline is stunning with volcanic cliffs and desert plants. Look for sub-tropical fish and manta rays under the water and sea lions basking at Los Islotes. Birders can see osprey, magnificent frigatebirds, blue-footed and brown boobies, grebes, herons, brown pelicans and a variety of gulls.

The divers will leave the bay and get out into the open waters of the Sea of Cortes. All your equipment will be provided and you'll have professional guides. Look for sea lions, sardines, barracudas and giant jaw fish. Back on land you can hike around the island or try stand-up paddleboarding in the turquoise waters of the bay.

The group will reconvene for a seafood lunch on the white sand beach of Ensenada Grande, and in the afternoon everyone will have the opportunity to swim with the biggest fish on earth -- the whale shark. A secluded mangrove reef provides food and shelter from tropical storms for the whale sharks, who migrate to La Paz each December through March. Snorkel gear will be provided and local guides will teach us about the whale sharks and remind us that touching these gentle creatures is strictly prohibited.

Arrive at Marina Costa Baja, and check into your room at the **Costa Baja Resort & Spa**. Dinner will feature what La Paz is famous for -- fish tacos at a local restaurant.

DAY THREE

MONDAY, MARCH 9

Todos Santos

After breakfast at your hotel, we'll head South to the magical town of Todos Santos. This is Mexico's last frontier, home of the famed Hotel California and known for its art galleries, surfing beaches and local candymakers.

Having chosen your activity ahead of time, some of you will be learning to surf on Los Cerritos Beach, halfway between La Paz and Los Cabos on the Pacific side of the peninsula. You'll practice on land, getting your technique down before catching waves on your own. Then we'll dry off and have a guided tour through historic Todos Santos, visiting with working artists in their studios and finally ending at Hotel California for a drink.

Other members of the group will join **Todos Santos Eco Adventures** team at a local biking shop in Todos Santos to get outfitted with a mountain bike before hitting the desert single tracks with views of the Sierra La Laguna mountains to the east and the dramatic coastline to the west. Look for endemic Baja cacti, Torotes (or Elephant Trees) and other desert vegetation. You might also see jackrabbits, chipmunks, roadrunners, quail, hummingbirds, orioles, gnatcatchers and doves...but probably not too many other humans!

Lunch for both the mountain bikers and the surfers will be held at El Mirador Ocean View Restaurant from **Guaycura Boutique Hotel**.

After lunch you'll head back to La Paz and have some time to relax before our first **MARKETPLACE** of AdventureWeek Baja Sur at your hotel, **Costa Baja Resort & Spa**. This will be your opportunity to meet one-on-one with local tour operators and outfitters from La Paz, Todos Santos and Los Cabos. Cocktails and dinner will follow with more time for casual networking with local suppliers.

DAY FOUR

TUESDAY, MARCH 10

La Paz / Magdalena Bay

After breakfast in La Paz you'll head to **RED Sustainable Travel's** picturesque sea turtle research camp, nestled into a narrow spit that divides Bahía Magdalena and Bahía Almejas. You'll take a panga, a typical fishing boat, for a 20-minute trip to the camp. Upon arrival at the camp you will have time to settle into your double occupancy tents.

The waters here are a home and nursery to marine life, including dolphins, migratory gray whales, and endangered sea turtles, as well as providing habitat for some of the most productive fisheries in Mexico. Marine and migratory birds are also found here, including the southernmost nesting colony of bald eagles, ospreys, caracaras, numerous species of heron, and the black brant, which migrates seasonally from the Arctic tundra.

RED's camp is surrounded by red, black and white mangrove species, and travelers will learn about the important role they each play in this rich ecosystem. Look for resident coyotes, often spotted playing along the shoreline and swimming in the estuary.

After lunch our guides will give us a briefing on their research and sea turtle monitoring, then you'll be boarding the pangas again to join the fishermen who will be setting turtle research nets in the estuary and initiating the monitoring process. You'll get the chance to paddle a kayak through the mangrove channels until you arrive to one of the beaches for a fun hike up and down the sand dunes until you reach the summit for a breathtaking sunset. You'll return to the camp walking along Magdalena Bay, and after freshening up, you'll enjoy a dinner surrounded by nature at its best and nothing else.

There will be stargazing and a campfire after dinner. Sea turtle monitoring continues through the night and you can optionally sign up for shifts to accompany the turtle monitoring team on the boats to check the research nets every two hours. You are encouraged but not required to participate in this unique experience. Captured turtles will be brought back to camp to be measured, weighed and tagged before being released.

Overnight: **RED Sustainable Travel's turtle research camp** - in a shared but spacious tent outfitted with mattress, blankets and linens.

DAY FIVE

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 11

Magdalena Bay / Loreto Bay National Marine Park

After a night in the company of the stars, sand dunes and sea turtles you'll depart the turtle research camp towards Puerto Cancún and on to Loreto Bay Marine National Park. The marine park was created in 1996 and inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2005. It boasts over 800 species of marine life, many of which are currently endangered. The **Sea Kayak Baja Mexico** crew will take us navigating. Through the waters of the park, we'll look for blue whales before arriving at Playa Blanca in Isla Coronados, where before lunch, you will have the chance to do some snorkeling, kayaking or paddleboarding.

After lunch we return to the marina and head to the city of Loreto where you'll check into the Loreto Bay Resort with enough time to rest before our second **MARKETPLACE**, where you'll meet with tour operators and outfitters from Loreto, Comondú and Mulegé. Afterwards, enjoy cocktails and continue with more casual networking over dinner.

DAY SIX

THURSDAY, MARCH 12

Loreto / San Ignacio

After an early breakfast, get ready for a long drive with **Aventuras México Profundo** across the Baja peninsula heading north to San Ignacio. Multiple stops along the way will include a hike through a dry riverbed to learn the geological, botanical and historical importance of these so-called vados. You'll also stretch your legs at El Rosario Valley, a region in the peninsula known for its giant columnar cacti on a volcanic cobblestone road, leading to a beautiful overlook to our next stop, Concepcion Bay. Anyone who wants to can take a cooling swim in the beautiful bay before we continue to Playa Santispac for lunch at a local fisherman's restaurant.

As we say in Mexico, "*panza llena corazón contento*" ("full belly, happy heart"). We continue our journey after lunch and stop briefly at the historic French town of Santa Rosalia, where we can admire the metal church designed by Gustav Eiffel and visit the oldest bakery on the peninsula. Our final stop on the way to San Ignacio will be at the Tres Virgenes volcano for a short hike through the Vizcaino Biosphere Reserve. The design of today's itinerary should give you options to consider when designing trips for your guests, but we will move swiftly through most stops in order to get to San Ignacio by the end of the day.

Upon arrival to the village of San Ignacio the group will split in two and proceed to two different hotels where you will check into your double occupancy rooms and get some rest before dinner at the **Desert Inn Hotel**.

Overnight: Comfortable shared rooms at either **Hotel Desert Inn** or **Hotel La Huerta**.

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DAY SEVEN

FRIDAY, MARCH 13

Sierra de San Francisco / San Ignacio Lagoon

You'll take your breakfast to go this morning as you head to the Sierra de San Francisco mountains. Combining several scenic hikes, we'll explore the mountain range, which includes 7,500-year-old cave paintings, designated by UNESCO and considered the most important rock painting sites in all of the Americas. We'll have a certified guide with us at the sites who will bring history to life through stories.

The Rancheros or local farmers invite us for lunch and share with us their indigenous food, the same meals missionaries cooked and ate while trying to colonize these northern territories. The missionary culture of Baja California Sur is the cultural foundation of the American cowboy. We might have time for one last hike in the Sierra de San Francisco before leaving the town of San Ignacio for the San Ignacio Lagoon, a gray whale sanctuary. Get settled at the Whale Watching Camp on the shore of the lagoon for a relaxing dinner and evening.

Overnight: Shared tents at the **Aventuras Mexico Profundo Whale Watching Camp**. The permanent igloo dome tents are so spacious that one can almost stand in them. The tents are each equipped with two cots with sleeping mats (colchoneta), bed sheets, sleeping bag and/or blankets and pillows.

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DAY EIGHT

SATURDAY, MARCH 14

San Ignacio Lagoon / Loreto

Throughout Baja Sur there are opportunities to have up close and personal encounters with marine creatures, but there are special places that seem to be a favorite of the gray whales. San Ignacio Lagoon is a dreamlike place to get up-close and personal with these giants. We'll be escorted by **Aventuras Mexico Profundo's** knowledgeable guides on motor boats as we search for gray whales.

On our way to Loreto this afternoon we'll stop at the Mulegé mission dating back to 1705. Mulegé is an oasis of tall palm trees in the desert. We'll make a stop at the oldest and largest cactus in the region before arriving in Loreto.

The last night of AdventureWeek Baja Sur is spent back at the Loreto Bay Resort. Our farewell dinner will be at Domingo's Place, where we'll share stories and memories of our time together and our hosts will invite us to spread the word about our incredible experiences.

PACKING LIST

- Shorts and long pants or convertibles
 - Long-sleeve shirts (sun protection)
 - T-Shirts

 - Binoculars / Flashlight (with red light if possible) / extra batteries

- Toothbrush, toothpaste

- Please consider packing what you may need urgently in your carry-on luggage, such as personal medications and 1 overnight change of clothing.



WHAT TO EXPECT

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS

VISA REQUIREMENTS: No Visa requirement for US and Canadian citizens.

PASSPORT REQUIRED: Passport needed for entrance and departure at airports in Mexico.

WEATHER: Although March has fresh weather, sun may be very strong in some places. We recommend using sunblock for better protection and to avoid sunburns.

HEALTH CONCERNS: Mosquitos may be present at various locations during the trip, so we encourage you to cover up and bring your own organic insect repellent, since we will be visiting some protected areas demanding the use of organic personal hygiene items only.

ELECTRICITY: 110v / 60Hz. The socket type is A/B, the same as in the USA. Please bring adaptors and/or converters with you, if necessary.

TIME ZONE: Baja California Sur, Mexico is on U.S. Mountain Standard Time or GMT -7 hrs.

CURRENCY: Mexican Peso. The exchange rate is approximately 14-15 Pesos to the US Dollar.

INTERNET: In room wireless internet will be available at Costa Baja Resort & Spa and Loreto Bay Resort for free. At San Ignacio, we will be staying at two different hotels: Hotel La Huerta offers in-room wireless internet and Hotel Desert Inn offers wireless internet in lobby areas. Please be aware that we will also be staying at remote campsites where internet may not be available or if available, the speed might be too low for a large group to use simultaneously.

WATER: Disposable water bottles will be available in rooms at Loreto Bay Resort and Costa Baja Resort & Spa. Water bottles will also be provided by operators during some activities on the itinerary and during transfers for everyone.

FOOD: Most meals will feature some kind of seafood, meat (red or white) and sides like vegetables, rice, pasta, fruit and tortillas. Box lunches will also be coordinated on specific days due to early transfers noted in the itinerary. Beverages such as water, sodas and beer will be offered during most meals. Not all dietary requirements can be met for every meal, but we will try to accommodate special needs during the itinerary including vegetarian meals and specific allergies. Please plan to travel with a small quantity of your favorite energy snacks.

MEAL TIMES: We will start the day with a light breakfast (desayuno) or a heavier breakfast/brunch (almuerzo) between 9am-Noon. Lunch, (comida) is generally eaten between 2-4pm and is the main meal of the day, generally consisting of more than one course, but on early breakfast days, we aim to have earlier lunches (around 1-2pm). Dinner (la cena) may consist of just a hot drink and some bread, but it could also be a nice meal eaten in a restaurant between 7-9pm. Though you'll find plenty to snack on as you go about your day, it's not a bad idea to pack a few of your favorite snacks along on your journey. (Hint: bring non-perishable snack bars that can clear customs; avoid nuts or dried fruit)

SHARING A ROOM: Due to limited availability we will be staying on double occupancy basis at the camping sites in Bahía Magdalena and Laguna de San Ignacio and also at the hotels in San Ignacio.

IMPORTANT CULTURAL ASPECTS: In México, tips are commonly given to waiters at restaurants, it usually consists of the 10% or 15% of the total amount on your bill. It is recommended to buy souvenirs from local artisans or artists to encourage local economy and to take home something original from the regions you will be visiting.

TENT CAMPING:

Day 4 - The camping experience with RED Sustainable Travel is situated among the sand dunes, and provides stunning views of natural land and seascapes as well as local wildlife. Leave your travel pillow at home, as all tents are outfitted with mattresses, linens and blankets. Towels are provided, and our bathrooms and shower are integrated into the landscape. Composting toilets will be available for use at campsite. Electric connections won't be available, so it is recommended that you charge your camera or any electrical device the night before at your hotel. As tents are located in a remote and arid environment we ask that guests respect the surrounding habitat and use water wisely.

Day 7 - The camp at the shore of San Ignacio Lagoon is a permanent facility run in a completely sustainable manner, certified by Green Globe. Services include solar powered hot water showers, salt water toilets, hand washing facilities with biodegradable soap and a "comedor" (dining area) with electric light powered by sun and wind energy. The camping itself is double occupancy in preinstalled big igloo dome type tents in which it is almost possible to stand. The tents are each equipped with 2 cots, thin mattresses (colchonetas), bed sheets, sleeping bag and / or blankets and pillows.


