- El Triunfo: Old mining town
- The Malecón of La Paz 6-mile long beachfront boardwalk, excellent beaches, open air markets, museums, art galleries, fine and casual dining, nightclubs, and a theater.
- Sierra de La Laguna Biosphere Reserve UNESCO protected area on the southern tip of Baja California Peninsula, with access by the Todos Santos area







- Sierra de la Laguna Biosphere Reserve
- One of Baja's most beautiful but least explored areas
- Part of an island off the coast of Baja 10 million years ago, the Reserve is home to an incredible diversity of plant and animal life, many of them endemic species - over 23% of plants and 10% of animals found in the Reserve are endemic to the area.
- From the peak, there are panoramic views of both the Pacific Ocean and the Sea of Cortes









- Ranchero Culture in Baja California Sur
- Many of our vaqueros' ancestors are from Moorish Spain, and were hand-picked by the Jesuits for their farming and ranching skills, focus on family and integrity.
- They still do leatherworking, cheese-making, candy-making and tortilla-preparation in much the same way they did 500 years ago, and they are masters at passing on these skills.





- Whale Watching in Todos Santos
- · Two main species visit our shores: the humpback and the gray
- The humpbacks are powerful and athletic and love leaping out of the water right near the boat. They generally are in the area mid-October to mid-April.
- The grays are gregarious and curious and come right up to the boat. They generally visit from the end of January through mid-March.
- We go out with local fishing captains to see the action.









- Five of the world's seven turtle species nest on the shores of Baja California Sur
- Volunteers have the opportunity to participate in night patrols to see females coming ashore to lay their eggs, then helping to relocate the eggs to a protected corral, where they are safe from predators and have a higher likelihood of hatching.
- Then you can release hatchlings from mature nests into the sea!







Baja California Sur is a true birder's paradise, with over 430 species – including 6 endemic species - in a close range of varied habitats.

Habitats include shorelines and dunes, estuaries, palm oases, islands, bays, mangroves, and the Sierra de la Laguna mountains.










- National Geographic has listed surfing in Todos Santos as one of its best adventure destinations!
- Todos Santos has great beaches for learning to surf, with smooth sandy bottoms and clean, unpolluted waters.
- Smaller waves for beginners roll gently into shore, while bigger waves for more advanced surfers break further out.
- There are great surf spots all over the Cape region for surfers of all skill levels. Surfing is a great sport for all, regardless of body type or fitness level – fun for the whole family!





The Guaycura and Pericu Indians are now extinct, but evidence of their lives in Baja California Sur is all around us.

There are over 300 documented rock art sites in the cape region of BCS.



CABO PULIMO NATIONAL MARINE PARK

The Cabo Pulmo National Marine Park is home to the Sea of Cortez's only living coral reef - the northernmost coral reef in the eastern Pacific - and is a UN World Heritage Site.

The marine park was established in 1995 as a result of the efforts of local citizens who wanted to restore the marine life that had been dramatically depleted due do overfishing.

In 2009 the Scripps Institute of Oceanography in San Diego released the results of a 10-year study on Cabo Pulmo in which they called the park the "most robust marine preserve in the world", and demonstrated that the total amount of fish in the reserve had increased 460% between 1999 and 2009.

Cabo Pulmo has recovered to a level comparable to a pristine site that has never been fished by humans and it's an absolutely remarkable place to investigate.


